

**VIRGINIA STATE COUNCIL OF ESA
1998 CONVENTION MINUTES**

The 45th Annual Convention of the Virginia State Council was held at the Travelodge in Winchester, Virginia, May 15 through May 17, 1998. The theme ESA's Prime Time and was hosted by Alpha Omega, Beta Nu, Iota Epsilon and Delta Rho.

FRIDAY

The Convention began with the President's Reception between 5:30 and 6:30 PM. Mildred Edward's and her officers gathered in the Banquet Hall to welcome all ESA attendees to convention. From 7:45 until 8:30 PM the Candidates Fair was held in the Banquet Hall. Candidates running for state office handed out favors and solicited votes. The mixer party followed with a "Looney Tunes" theme. The DJ was Johnny Walker from Baltimore, Maryland. Each candidate was dressed as a "Looney Tunes" character.

SATURDAY

The Chapter President's Workshop was presented by Beverly Scott beginning at 8:00 AM until 8:30 AM. Also beginning at 8:00 AM, President Mildred held a First Time Convention Goers Coffee in room 244.

FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The First General Assembly was called to order by Marie LaDuke, First Vice President at 9:00 AM. She introduced Mildred Edwards, the Virginia State Council's 44th President, who declared the 45th Virginia State Council in session. The flag ceremony was conducted by Bobbie Massey, IC Recording Secretary, from New Mexico.

DEVOTIONS - Jean Mullikin read "Only Angels Can Wing It...The Rest of Us Have To Practice".

Everyone stood, took the hand of her sister and repeated the Opening Ritual.

WELCOME - Sue Boyd, Beta Nu, welcomed everyone to Winchester and ESA's Prime Time. She stated "ESA is our common thread" and reminded us we are part of a first rate women's organization.

The Assembly recessed for the Workshops from 9:45 AM - 10:00 AM. Workshops held were: Awards, Gail Lanning; Circle of Life, Sue Boyd; Educational, Marjorie Harmon; Finance, Christine Adams; Foundation, Beverley Wright; Parliamentary Procedure, Brenda Bowersox; Publicity, Helen Neff; Rushing, Sharon Shaffer; Social, Sylvia Dailey; and Philanthropic, Lynne Rightmeyer.

The second General Assembly was called to order at 10:00 AM.

STATE PROJECT REPORT - Mildred announced in the absence of Robin Bellamy, Sandy Reed would give the report. For 1997-98 a total of \$10,284.56 was raised giving \$5,142.28 each to ASK and Camp Fantastic. Seventeen chapters sent in donations and twelve chapters sent in the Dot Harcum State Project Award Entry form on time. In Robin's report she stated: "I was quite honored two years ago when Beverly Scott asked me to be the State Project Director for 96-98. I am very proud to be the chairman of the award my mother sponsors in her 20 year anniversary. I of course was just a "baby" when she was State President".

Laura Cain, representing Camp Fantastic and also an ESA Sister discussed Camp Fantastic and how the money is used that is raised by Virginia State ESA Chapters. The area covered is Virginia, Maryland, and DC and the money goes directly for the camp. It pays for food and lodging and is offered to families so they can stay free of charge. She thanked us for our support.

INTRODUCTIONS - Mildred introduced special guests, IC Representative Bobbie Massey (IC Recording Secretary); and SERC Representative, Glen Gay SERC Recording Secretary); Jean Mullikin, Chaplain; Theresa Seay, Treasurer; Fran Lanning, Corresponding Secretary; Sharon Shaffer, Second Vice President; Marie LaDuke, First Vice President; Beverly Scott, Jr. Past President; Brenda Orebaugh, Recording Secretary; and Brenda Bowersox, Parliamentarian.

Mildred asked for all the Past Presidents to stand and she recognized each one with something she remembered about that person. She recognized District Council Presidents and Chapter Presidents. Members were recognized for

attending their first state conventions. First Pearl achievers as well as Pallas Athene degree achievers were recognized.

CORRESPONDENCE - Fran Lanning. Correspondence was received from B. J. Clark (and Chuck), Executive Director, IC Headquarters; Virginia Claggett, IC President; and letters of regret from NC, SC, AL, KY, TN, FL, and MD.

RULES OF THE CONVENTION - Brenda Bowersox moved that the rules of the convention be adopted as published in the convention brochure. A second not being required and there being no discussion, the motion was carried.

QUORUM - According to the Virginia State Council By-laws, a quorum shall consist of representatives from five (5) Virginia Chapters and one (1) Officer. There being a quorum present, all business voted upon shall constitute effective action.

INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL MESSAGE - Bobbie Massey, IC Recording Secretary from Animas, New Mexico. She encouraged all Virginia Sisters to attend the IC Convention in St. Louis, Missouri, and support our Virginia State Sister, Flora Burns, who is running for Second Vice President. She noted the Opening Ceremony and First General Assembly will be on Wednesday instead of Thursday. She noted Virginia is a pioneer in the Walking the Dog. The States are walking as a team this year. A "mountain of towels" will be built for Easter Seals Camp at convention this year. Each person is asked to bring one white towel and one white washcloth. Easter Seal ornaments will also be available. A donation of \$10 will be asked for this year. ESA Foundation Gamefest will be on Tuesday night as well as the Go for the Gold. There are several proposed By-law changes. (1) Proposed change to vote for convention site five years out instead of three. This is being proposed because convention centers will not confirm without a contract. (2) District Councils and PPA's will have to pay IC dues because there are more non-profit entities in the United States than they are for profit and therefore the IRS is looking very closely at non-profit organizations and questioning who is and is not non-profit. District Councils must pay IC Dues, file Tax Facts at the end of year and must have a Tax ID number. Tax Facts are filed in September. If you have any problems with filing your tax facts, contact Doug Mills at IC Headquarters. If this By-law is approved, District Councils will get a vote at IC. She also noted a special for new members which is in effect until May 31, 1998 whereby three new members can join for \$100. The Legacy Program is still in effect at \$10.00 per person joining. Bobbie presented Mildred with the Explorer Award. She ended by telling us what a HUG means.

She encouraged members to subscribe to the SERCH Magazine and passed around an envelope if anyone wanted to sign up for it that day. Cost is \$5.00. She reminded everyone that there is an open SERC Board Meeting at IC Convention in St. Louis on July 9 for anyone who wants to attend. She reminded us SERC Conference will be in Bowling Green, Kentucky on October 30, 31 at University Plaza Hotel. She left registration forms and hotel forms with Marie LaDuke. She finished up with a personality test by having each one draw a pig.

Brenda Bowersox, Parliamentarian , presented the Proposed Standing Rule By-law changes:

Standing Rule 7: Proposed change: To delete the words “**and trophies**” from the initial statement and to delete the types of trophies from contests a through n.

Coming from the committee, this does not need a second. There was no discussion. MOTION PASSED.

Standing Rule 8(g): Proposed change: To delete the word **outline** from the second sentence.

Discussion: Cindy Maxwell, Beta Kappa. Concerned we will get less participation if changed.

Betty Allen, Alpha Chi. Betty asked how many submitted this year were in narrative form and how many was in outline form.

Cindy stated she had received nine submittals this year and approximately one-half were in outline form and one- half narrative form.

Sharon Shaffer, Iota Epsilon, stated she had been historian last year and feels when you have an outline you don't fully develop story into a narrative.

There being no further discussion the vote was called for: Yes - 23 votes; No - 16 votes. MOTION PASSED.

Brenda noted 8e, Part 3, Educational Award is missing. She will make sure this is put back in.
