International Council Updates

During a recent State President's ZOOM meeting we were made aware of the following updates:

IC Bylaw Changes

Earlier in the fall I forwarded you the proposed bylaw changes. After lots of questions and comments from the membership the committee has dropped all of those proposals and is starting from scratch. As of this month, there is one new proposal and it is concerning voting at IC convention. As was explained to us, individual members are members of Epsilon Sigma Alpha, chapters are members of the International Council, so only as a chapter can you vote at the IC level. State credentials will continue as previously with each state president carrying the votes of the state's chapters. **The proposed change is for that vote to become electronic instead of by paper ballot.** There are several apps or programs that can be used for this but none have been selected as yet. The electronic vote will take place at convention at a pre-selected time. The committee is accepting any additional proposed changes until Jan. 1. I will keep you posted on any new information as it comes to me.

ESA Coffee Chats for December will only be on Monday, December 14.


President's Leadership

VSC GUIDELINES... LET YOUR PRIOR EXPERIENCE PROVIDE DIRECTION

Have you ever served in an elected or appointed position on the Virginia State Council and thought, "I wish I had some guidance on how to perform this job beyond the responsibilities outlined in the By-laws and Standing Rules!" Perhaps something came up during the year that lead you to implement a practice that made your job easier but it wasn't something that was passed along to the next person taking that position. If you have had any of this 'AHA MOMENTS', then do we have an opportunity for you!

During the VSC Executive Board retreat at SML in August 2020, President, Brenda Bowersox, proposed a committee be formed to START identifying and capturing these type practices in the form of a guide book or manual. Several members were identified to be Point People to capture any suggestions from chapter members in specific areas and try to answer any questions that may come up. It is NOT the purpose of this committee to change the By-laws/Standing Rules but to consider what is in these and capture any additional ideas, practices, suggestions which would make the position easier to understand and carry out the responsibilities.

Let me give you an example: As VSC Chaplain (many times), I finally realized there was a need to be able to capture the names of those Virginia sisters who had passed in several different time frames. For our state purposes, the timeline is May 1 – April 30; however, SERC wants the same information for the timeline of November 1 – October 31 and IC has a timeline of July 1 – June 30. By the time the SERC and IC Chaplain contacts the state, all the files have been turned over to the new VSC Chaplain and it is a struggle to try and go back and gather this information. As a 'guideline' for the VSC Chaplain, I would suggest keeping these other timelines in mind and creating a listing that can be turned over to the new VSC Chaplain.




Chapter Update – Beta Kappa, Virginia Beach – Ginny Hatchell, President
