# PRISCILLA BROWNING, ST JUDE COORDINATOR

I am excited to serve as the VSC St. Jude Coordinator this year. I have been busy volunteering at several events ALSAC sponsors to raise funds for the hospital in Memphis, TN. I will try to get in contact with the various members of the staff around the State of Virginia and provide them to you in a later issue. Although I do not have the opportunity to work a Dream Home, I can participate in Radiothons, Golf Tournaments, Walk Runs and Health Fairs. Looking forward to attending IC and SERC this year and meet new friends and rekindle time with old friends.

#### ST JUDE CHANGES

Perhaps the most significant change we heard about at IC was the change in the ESA/ALSAC relationship. While we are still a valued third-party donor for St. Jude, moving forward the Tier System is being retired. This means that our hours and mileage will no longer be converted to a cash equivalent. Members, Chapters and State will continue to be recognized for cash dollars raised at ESA Hosted Events but ALSAC Event Volunteer Hours will be tracked separately through the St. Jude VMS system.

The big news is that a new fundraising goal has been developed for ESA. We have been challenged to raise 5 million in cash over the next four years. This will coincide with the 100th anniversary of ESA. Reaching this milestone will give ESA the opportunity to have an outside naming opportunity on the St. Jude Campus. The opportunity to have ESA on the outside of a St Jude building or structure (think playground area) increases our visibility which increases our opportunities to fundraise and to attract new members.

This 5 million dollar goal is a cash only goal. We are being asked to develop our own fundraisers to raise this money for St. Jude. The only ALSAC hosted events that will count toward the goal are the St. Jude Walk-a-thon and the Memphis Marathon because both of those events allow us to raise funds through "Team ESA".

Additionally, our Partners in Hope dollars will count toward the goal but we will have to jump through a few hoops initially to make this work. The ESA Education Center has a Micro-Learning Lesson on how to set up "Partner in Hope" donations. Basically, we have to cancel our existing Partner in Hope donation and then go through the ESA website to re-establish the automatic withdrawal so that the monies are credited to ESA. I have played around with this process and am beginning to understand how it works. We will do a mini-lesson at the Fall meeting and I will try to have step-by-step directions as well. The website has ideas for fundraisers.

This is a big change to how we have accumulated dollars for St Jude and there will be angst and growing pains. I know we will work through them and rise to the challenge that has been placed before us.

# ST. JUDE WALK 2025



I'll share my personal favorites, let me know yours:


- Care packages Our chapter had sent care packages to my nephew when he was
