The first person to email me with the most correct identifications will receive a small gift from me at the Spring VSC Meeting.






By now, I think you know what having the IC Disaster Fund available to our members means and how important it is that we support it. It could be one of us who needs assistance one day.

Ginny collected supplies for the NoShame.Period projects for the schools. 68 Period packs and 32 pairs of panties were collected and delivered.

NoShame.Period's mission is to eliminate the shame and stigma of menstruation for this generation of students in Hampton Roads and beyond. No shame. Period was created to provide period packs, pamphlets, and pants to school nurses to share with their students and help them get what they need and get back to class comfortably and confidently. This nonprofit currently organizes over 150 volunteers and has compiled and delivered more than 8,000 period packs to schools all over southeastern Virginia.



Beta Kappa collected over \$250 in food items for a local food pantry. Beta Kappa has supported this pantry for several years and the community needs continue to rise.



Lou Ann organized the St Jude Walk again this year. There was no live event scheduled in the area so we decided since the National Walk was scheduled for September 27th, why not bring



\$3000! Thanks to all who donated!




How to change your St Jude Partner in Hope donation so your donation counts for ESA

- 1. Go to www.stjude.org/give/supporter-profile
- 2. Log into your St. Jude account.
- 3. You should see the screen that says: St. Jude My Supporter Account (see screen shot)



- 4. Your Gift Status button should be green and say Active.
- 5. Click the drop down button that says: Change Gift Status (see screen shot)



- 6. Choose cancel,
- 7. You have cancelled your St. Jude donation.
- 8. Now you are ready to create a new donation using the ESA link (directions on next page)

- 1. Go to ESA Member Center www.epsilonsigmaalpha.org/member-center
- 2. Log into your account
- 3. At the top of the screen under My Account you will see options Choose Education Center (screen shot below)
